GENERATIONS CLASSES AND WORKSHOPS

Clay is an exciting medium of expression for all ages! Explore the three major building blocks of clay handbuilding: coil, pinch pot, and slab. Guardians work alongside children and youth to create one-of-a-kind pieces of clay art. Once fired in the Casa kilns, students will have functional dishes to share with family and friends, all available three weeks after the last class. *Materials provided*.

BUILD-AN-ART CAMP DESCRIPTIONS

ART MIX-UP! Ages 6 – 9

VISUAL ARTS

YOUTH PAINTING AND DRAWING CLUB with Luka de Haan......\$160

Whether skilled at sketching, doodling, painting or completely new to art, teens will learn practical skills and techniques tailored to their skill level. Take traditional drawing and painting further through exploration and experimentation. Students receive a sketchbook for keeping all their original drawings in and engage with still-life drawing, portraiture, illustration, and perspective. *Materials provided*.

AGES 12 - 16

An introduction to cartooning and sequential storytelling! Begin with basic drawing techniques and character design, building towards narrative development, acting, and shading. Learn to build stories with panels and finish off your drawings with comic inking pens. Get ready to share your comics with the world! *Materials provided*.

AGES 13 - 17

From raw clay to functional pots, this studio practice is for novice and seasoned potters alike. Students will learn how to prepare clay for the wheel, center, and pull clay into various ceramic forms. Trimming, glazing, and surface design will be covered with improving technique as the primary focus. Students learn basic handbuilding techniques such as pinch-pot, coil, and slab construction for sculpture projects. Proper use of clay tools will be explored while individual creativity and goals will be fostered. Pick up your new ceramic pieces three weeks following the last class. *Materials provided*.

AGES 12 - 15

ALLIED ARTS COUNCIL BURSARY PROGRAM

The Allied Arts Council provides a Bursary Program to ensure adults with accessibility requirements, children, and youth can access Casa Core classes offered by the AAC at Casa regardless of financial capacity.

Child and Youth Bursary (ages 6 – 16): Students wishing to receive a bursary must complete a Bursary Application which is available from the front desk at Casa. Families are eligible for a total of five bursaries per student in a calendar year. Bursaries are valued at 75% of the youth or child class fee.

Accessibility Modified Art Program for Adults (AMAPA): Students wishing to receive a bursary must complete a Bursary Application which is available from the front desk at Casa. Students are eligible for up to five bursaries in a calendar year. Bursaries are valued at 75% of the class fee. See following pages for eligible AMAPA classes.



Approval of the Bursary Application and payment of the 25% registration fee are required before the student will be admitted to a class.

FEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The City of Lethbridge Fee Assistance Program eases financial barriers that prevent low-income Lethbridge residents from accessing local recreation and culture activities. Applicants who meet eligibility requirements may receive fee assistance for one program/activity to a maximum of \$150 per person twice annually.

- · Individuals can use this program towards arts, culture, recreation, and sports opportunities
- Individuals qualify for up to \$150 in the first half of the year and \$150 in the second half of the year

Qualifying classes must be a minimum of 4 days/classes in length (can be used for summer camps). To access this program, individuals must:

- Visit www.lethbridge.ca/feeassistance and complete the online form
- Upload proof of City of Lethbridge residency (utility bill, bank statement, or government issued mail showing name and address)

POPPY PUFFTER: MAY 1 - MAY 29

Poppy Puffter has been a practicing drag artist in Lethbridge for 4 years, performing in numerous shows and productions for a diversity of audiences. Lately, she's been producing her own drag show under Babes & Brews, and considers herself an emerging artist/producer. Poppy's practice tells a story of queer experiences through the use of spoken word and song, accompanied by props, costumes, make up, reveals, movement and acting. During her residency she will create a "one woman show" that explores her own personal journey of childhood and queer identity, while playing with themes of shame, guilt, joy, and love (self, romantic, platonic).

ARLENE WESTEN: JUNE 2 - JUNE 30

Ever since she can remember, Arlene Westen has been drawn to the colour blue. This fascination has led her to explore the realms of indigo and cyanotypes through surface-designed textiles.

Indigo, with its rich history and cultural resonance, offers a profound metaphor for change and renewal. The alchemical process of dyeing with indigo—where the fabric emerges greenish-yellow and transforms to a deep blue upon exposure to air—symbolizes metamorphosis and rebirth. Cyanotype, with its enchanting simplicity and serendipitous outcomes, complement the exploration of blue. By placing objects or drawings on light-sensitive surfaces and exposing them to sunlight, she will create ethereal blueprints that capture the essence of light, shadow, permanence, and impermanence.

During her residency, Westen will focus on traditional techniques such as hand-stitching on resist-dyed and cyan-printed textiles. She looks to create intricate patterns and textures that resonate historical significance, while incorporating contemporary design elements influenced by the natural world and the rhythms of nature.

STITCH, GATHER, KNOT AND DYE

INDIGO AND SHIBORI WORKSHOP in the Textile Studio......\$25 Sunday, June 22 from 10 am - 4 pm (with a 1 hour lunch from 12 pm - 1 pm)

Explore the fundamentals of indigo dyeing and discover the beauty of Shibori, a Japanese tie-dye method. Learn the essential techniques of binding, folding, stitching, and clamping to create stunning patterns and textures on fabric. Gain confidence in dyeing your own creations with Indigo and discover the joy of transforming plain fabrics into precious textiles. *Materials provided*.

OPEN HOUSE in the Atrium Thursday, June 26 from 5 pm - 7 pm

APPLICATIONS:

The residency program at Casa provides an opportunity for artists from across disciplines to pursue their practice in a supportive, community-based atmosphere. 

LITER ARY ARTS

Let your creativity flow through words! Published author and editor, Halli Reid, will guide you through an intensive creative writing workshop. Zoom past the basics of plot, theme, character, and setting to get to the heart of your story. With a focus on motivation, impact, and subtext, students will learn how to turn basic words into enthralling storytelling. Participants bring their own notebooks and writing implements. - Demonstrated proficiency and studio orientation are required for studio access.
- A buddy system is recommended for after-hours studio access.

FACILITY BOOKINGS

Casa was designed to provide appropriate space for the creation and presentation of works of art from artists working in all disciplines. Each space is designed and equipped to accommodate the unique requirements of specific arts practices. Space can be booked for classes, workshops, performances, lectures, film screenings and special events. Room bookings are coordinated by the Operations Manager and spaces are assigned based on intended use and numbers. Arts-based programming will have booking priority.

Available spaces for booking include the Community Room, Meeting Room, Dance Studio, Rotary Square, and the Upper Patio.

Rental rates are based on a sliding fee scale ranging from \$25 to \$85/hour. Extra staffing and other incidental costs will be charged to bookings that extend beyond normal hours of operation.

PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

Casa is a well-used facility with many events occurring on a daily basis, including classes, rehearsals, meetings, concerts and more. Photography and videography, for personal or professional use, is welcome and permitted in the facility as space is available. Safety in all uses of Casa is of utmost importance and we ask all users to be respectful of the facility. Regulations for the photography policy can be found on the Casa website. Space will be booked first come, first served.
